

# COMMUNITY GROUP QUESTIONS

**OPEN:** What are your favorite Thanksgiving traditions? As your group shares, see if you can discover fun new ways for your family to give thanks for their blessings.

**DIG:** In preparation for your group meeting, it would be helpful to review the following passages and be prepared to discuss their significance regarding the way we think about sexual behavior today: Romans 1:18-32, 1 Corinthians 6:9-20, and Ephesians 5:1-8

What can we learn in the story of Jesus and the adulterous woman in John 8:1-11? Can Jesus' statements regarding this woman's sexual sin be applied to homosexual behavior? Is it possible to be lovingly "intolerant"? Why or why not?

How might believers respond to the following statements:

- "I think people should be able to love who they want to love."
- "Pornography doesn't hurt anyone."
- "Love isn't fully expressed until it's expressed sexually."
- "To be true to yourself, you must be who you are sexually."
- "You have no right to impose your morality on me."

How, if at all, is the approval of sexual immorality hurting the witness of the church? Why are all forms of sexual immorality wrong and harmful? How does Ephesians 5:1-3 help us distinguish between genuine love and sexual immorality?

**REFLECT:** Please take time to pray for those who are struggling with sexual temptations, and for those whose lives have been broken by sexual immorality.
