
CGROUP QUESTIONS

OPEN: As we begin 2017, what is one area you want to grow in your walk with the Lord?

DIG: Read Luke 10:2-12. What does Jesus mean when He says, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few"? What else can we learn from this passage about the world and our place in it as Christ-followers?

It's easier to have compassion when we know the circumstances. The biblical example of compassion is always a feeling AND an associated action. Read Luke 10:29-34 and discuss how the feeling and action of compassion play out in this parable.

Have you been the recipient of compassion? Share how that experience impacted your life. How about a time when you felt compassion but you didn't act on it? How would you handle that situation if you were given another chance?

It's often inconvenient to show compassion. We have busy schedules and things to do, but how can we be like the Good Samaritan who took time out of his day to do what was right at exactly the moment it was needed?

REFLECT: Read Hebrews 10:23-25. What does it mean to be stirred up or spurred on to love each other and do good works? Do you have a person in your life who spurs you on? If not, pray that the Lord would bring someone like that into your life.
